- 1. **Be polite and respectful**. Do not do anything that interferes with an officer's duties.
- 2. If the officer requests information or presents you with a warrant, subpoena, or order, tell the officer: "I understand that you're here in an official capacity. The UO generally cooperates with government investigations. I'm, however, obligated to call our General Counsel's office. I'm not authorized to provide

any information on any person or accept service of any warrant, subpoena, or order."

- 3. Ask for the officer's name, ID number, agency affiliation, and business card. Ask to make a copy of any document presented by the officer.
- Contact UO General Counsel's Office at (541) 346-3082 and provide the officer's identification information. Leave a voicemail if necessary. Email any document provided by the officer to gcounsel@uoregon.edu.
- 5. Get guidance from the UO General Counsel's Office about what requested documents or information may be provided, if any.
