- Your "Medical Home Away From Home"




Medical Services: Acute Care

- Drop-in or use the myUOHealth Portal to make an appointment




Medical Services: Specialty Care

 - Endocrine disorders





Medical Services: Where our Resources are Limited

- ADD/ADHD evaluations and stimulant prescriptions if you have a home prescriber, continue to use them. Otherwise, we will help refer to a community provider.
- Immunotherapy/allergy shots we will help refer to a community allergist
- **Eating Disorder treatment** we will help refer to a treatment team; if you have a treatment team, we can provide monitoring at UHS.
- Communicating with parents/families we'll need a current release of information (ROI) on file to do this!

 - Crisis Support




Influenza (Flu) (Annual)

- Submit vaccine records on the myUOHealth Portal
- Complete Tuberculosis (TB)
 Risk Assessment
- Exemptions for required vaccines
- Note that vaccines available at UHS!

Substance Abuse Prevention and Education

Teaches risk-reduction strategies to help students make safer choices around alcohol and drugs.



Sexual Violence Prevention and Education

First Year Students are required to do the Online Prevention Course, will receive an email invitation


Collegiate Recovery Center

Health Fee and Health Insurance



Understanding Health Costs: Health Service Fee

- Student Health Administrative Fee—Part of tuition and fees, NOT health insurance
- Ensures and support a healthier and safer campus:
 - After hours medical and counseling support 365 days/year
 - Triage nurse advice
 - Immunization compliance
 - Mental Health Services including the Mental Health Access Team, Counseling Services, after hours support and crisis support for mental health
 - Health Promotion and Wellness Services
 - Access to safer sex supplies
 - Campus communicable disease prevention and response
 - Medical evaluation and support for sexual assault survivors
 - UHS wellness center, to re-open in Winter term at the UO Rec Center!

We Bill Insurance for Medical and Allied Health Services

- Medical Services and Allied Health Services are billed to insurance and are not subsidized by the health fee
- Fees are similar to health services in the community
- Health insurance is required for international students.
- Balances not paid by insurance go to your DuckWeb account



Health Insurance and International Students

- UO requires that all international students have health insurance
- You are automatically billed for and enrolled in the UO Student Health Benefits Plan
- IMPORTANT If you have qualifying alternative insurance, you must submit a waiver by **October 8, 2025**

UO Student Health Benefits Plan

- Medical and prescription drug coverage
- Dental coverage
- Exceptional coverage (low cost-sharing)
- Works nationwide
- Dependent coverage available

How Much Does the Plan Cost; How Does it Work?

Plan Costs

- \$3,804 Annual Premiums
- \$1,268 per term, Billed to DuckWeb
- Equates to \$317 per month (for comparison purposes)

How Does it Work?

- Pay your premiums by October 8, 2025
- Download the mobile app myPacificSource
- Use the app to find in-network providers
- Show your digital ID card to all providers you see

How to Request a Waiver

- Review the waiver criteria
- Not all insurance plans meet the criteria
- Strictly enforced
- Complete an Insurance Waiver Request Form
- Upload proof of other coverage
- A new waiver is required each year





Waiver Criteria

- Register with UHS (complete forms)
- Upload insurance and immunization records
- Complete the TB Risk Assessment
- Schedule appointments
- Send and receive secure messages
- View statements
- View visit summaries
- And much more...







UHS Checklist

- ✓ Complete Vaccine Compliance process on the myUOHealth Portal
 - Enter Vaccine Dates and Upload Vaccine/Immunity Records
 - OR...File an Exemption; Vaccines are available at UHS
- ✓ Complete Required UHS Forms on the myUOHealth Portal
 - TB Risk Assessment
 - UHS Required Forms have a red *
- ✓ Pay your premium for the Student Health Benefits Plan or submit a waiver with a qualifying alternative insurance plan by October 8, 2025
- ✓ Set-up Care with UHS Provider

 Develop plan for managing any pre-existing conditions

 Upload past medical records in the myUOHealth Portal
- Have a thermometer and other self-care items handy!
