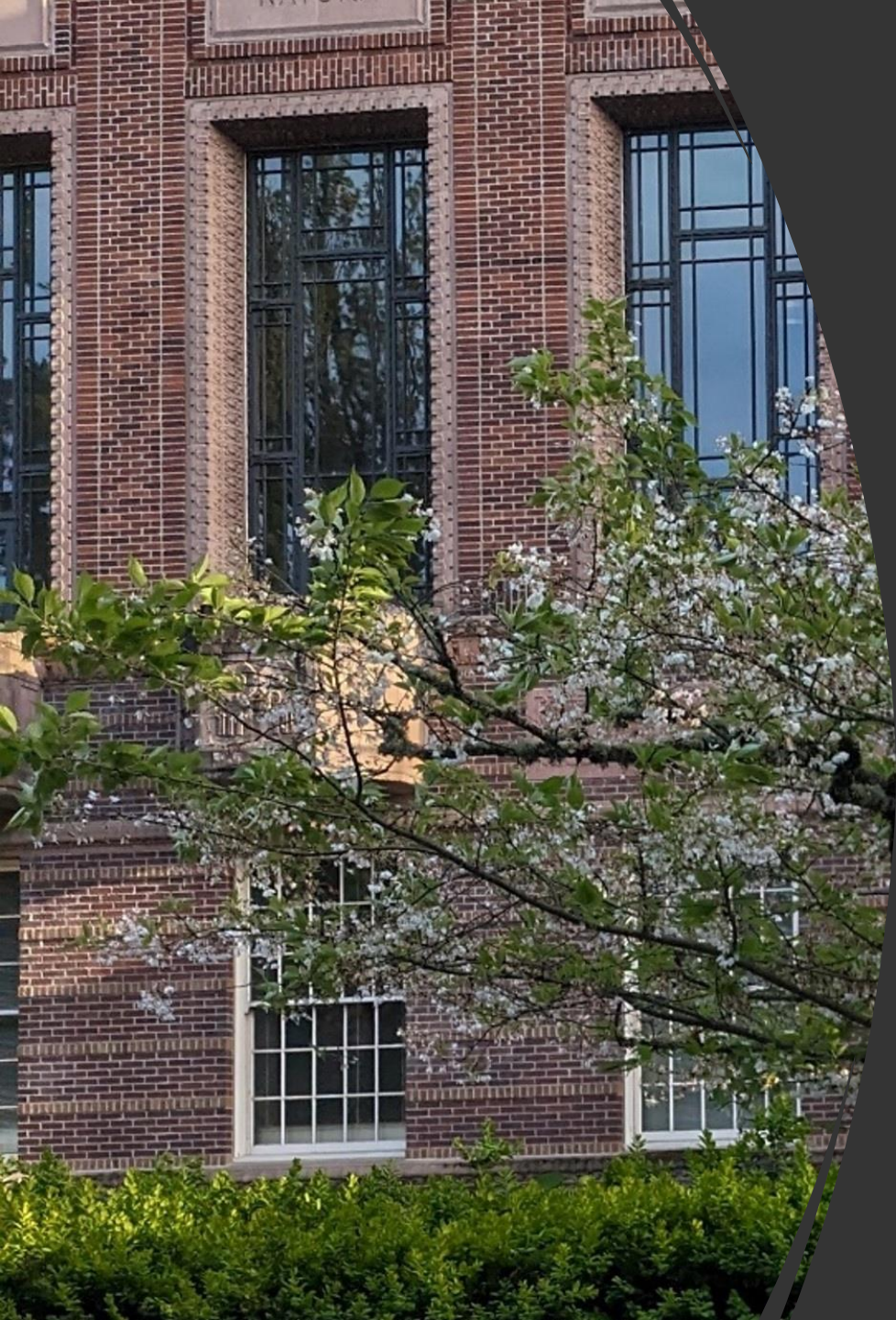

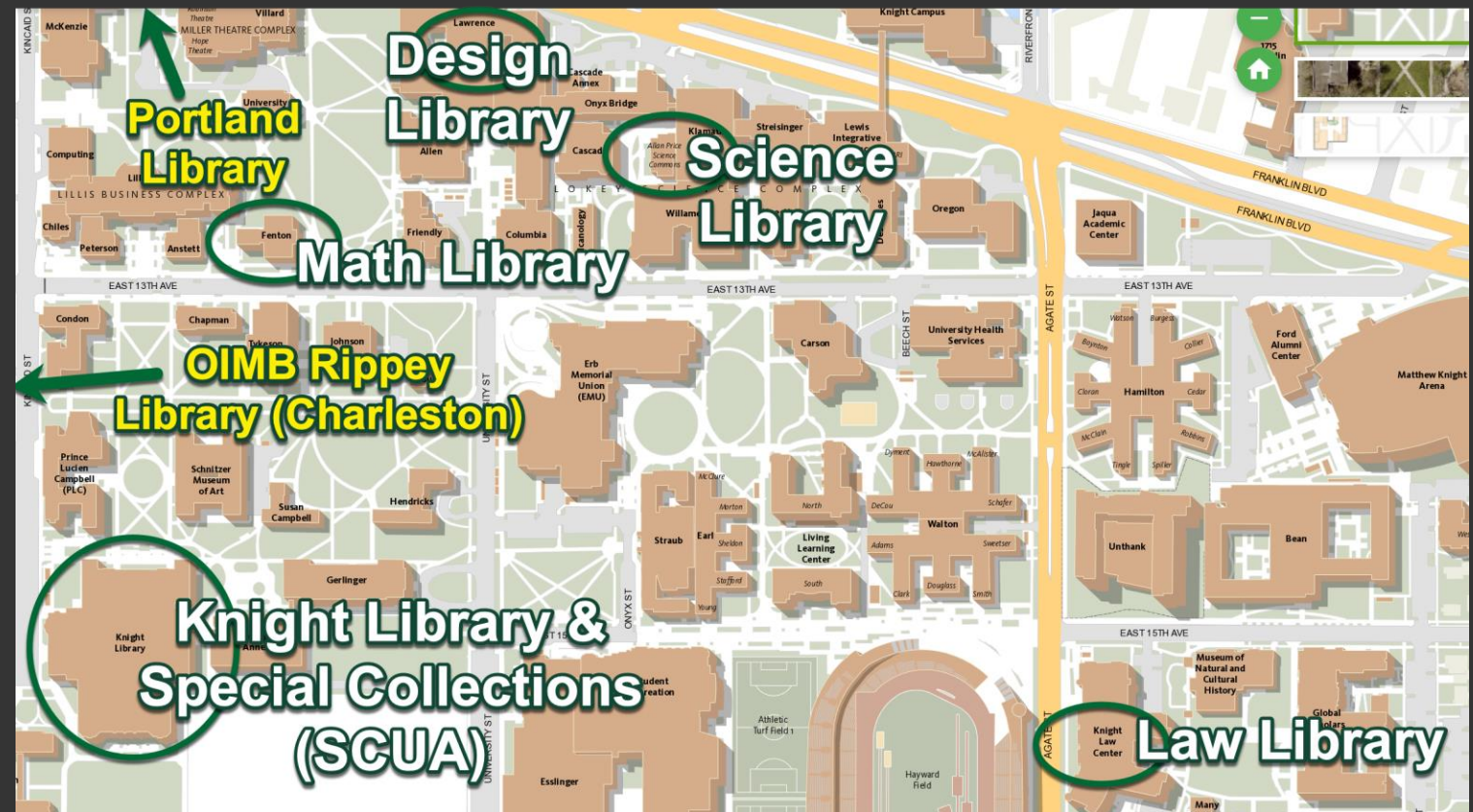

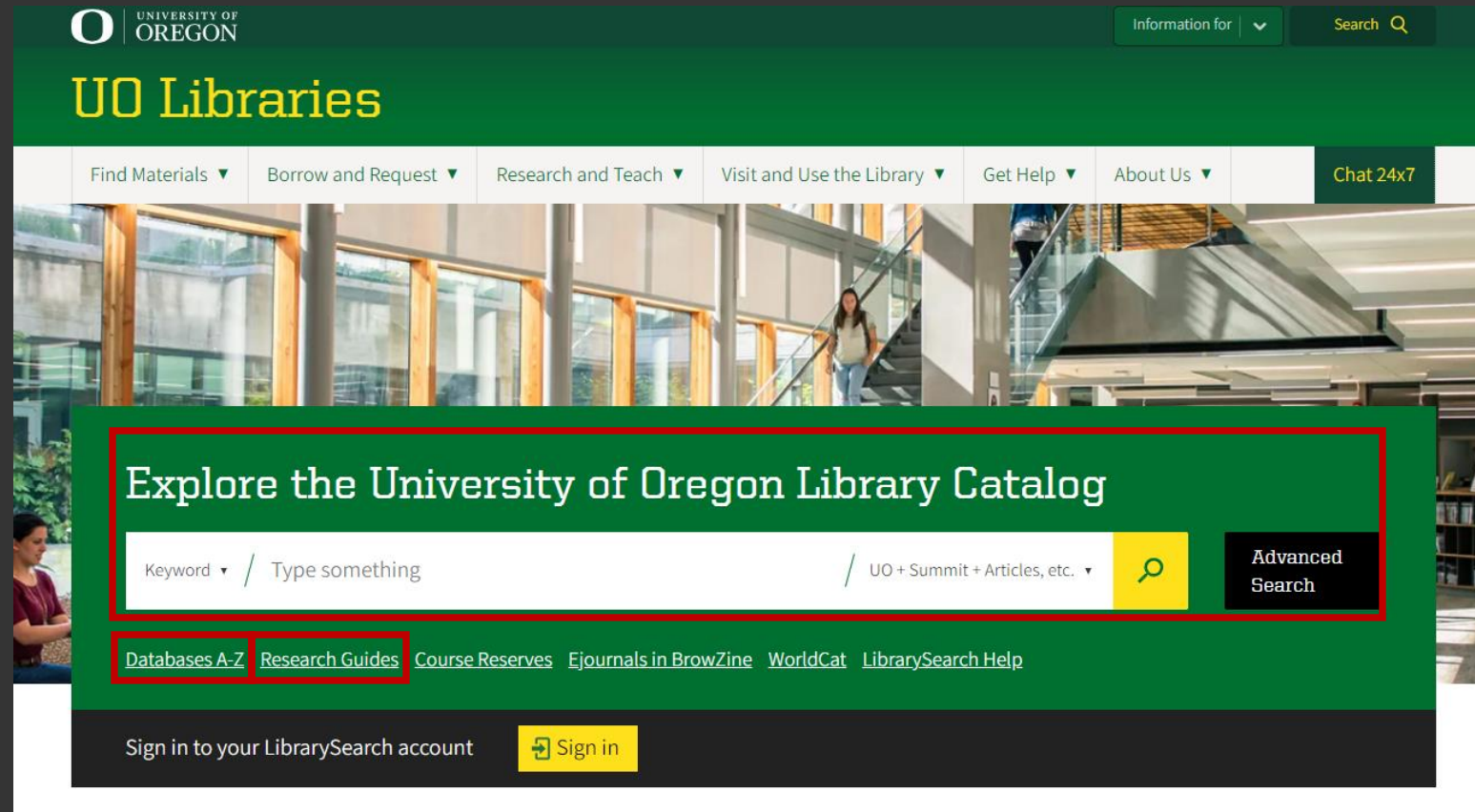
Start looking for books, articles, and more.

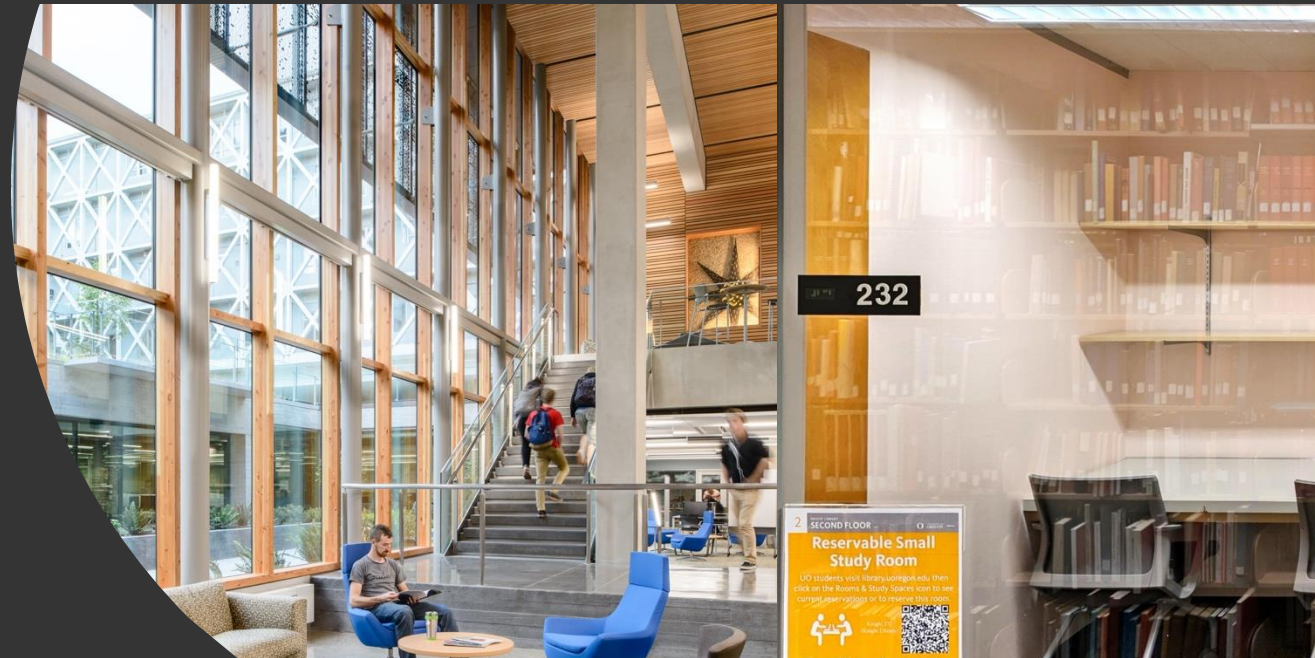

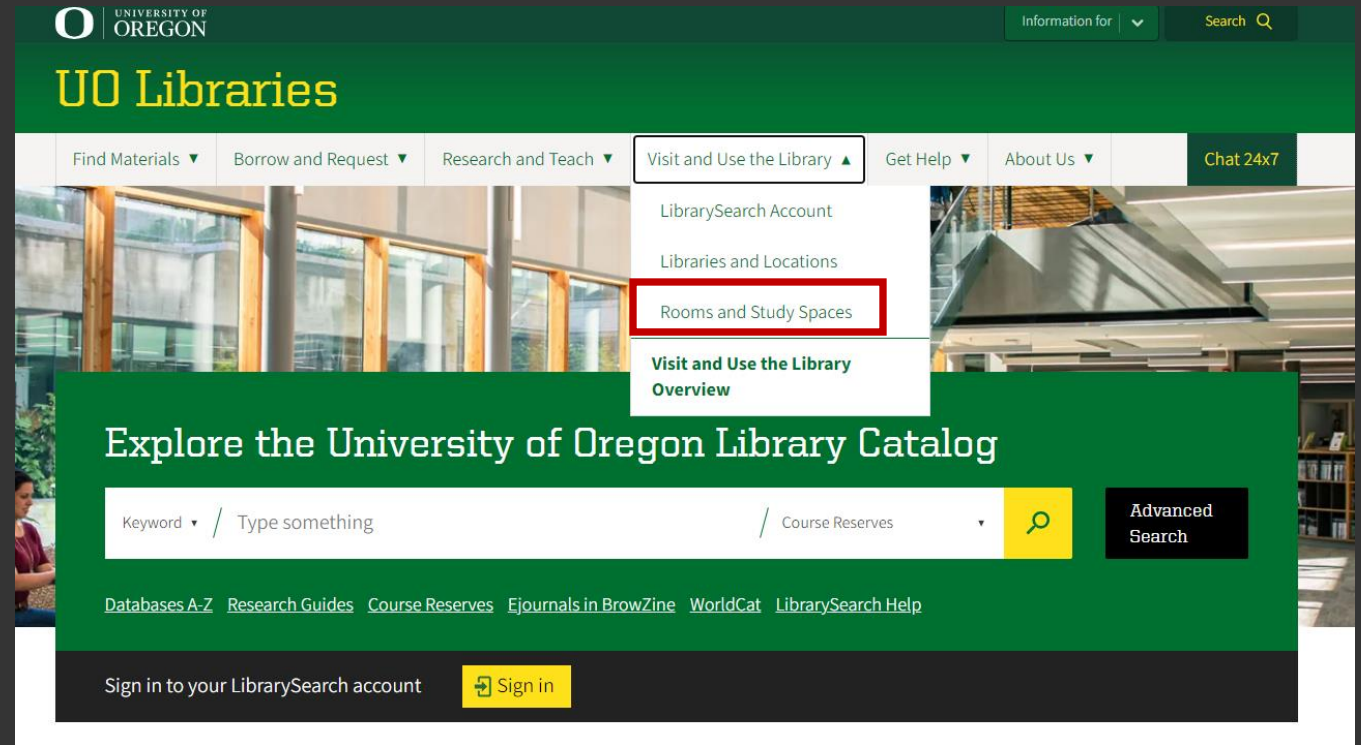
Study Spaces
