Course Reserves


- Course Reserves are books, videos, and other physical materials your professor has put on hold for your class.





- For most study rooms you can reserve rooms for up to six hours per week in 30-minute blocks, up to two hours in a single day.



Librarians can consult with you about your research. We can help you:


- refine your topic
